Tips for the ACT Reading Section

1) Before the test:

- Make a list of your best reading passages: prose, social science, humanities, natural science.
- Determine the target number of questions to answer
- 2) **Scan** the passages to determine the passage type and general difficulty.
 - Complete the passages in **your priority order**.
- 3) **Read/skim** the passage.
 - Summarize each paragraph in a few words. Build an **index**.
 - The first and last paragraphs are key. For each paragraph, the first and last sentences are key.
- 4) **Answer** the questions.
 - Answer easier questions (with line numbers) first, global questions last.
 - Sketch an answer to each question in your own words.
 - Eliminate any answers that are obviously wrong.
- 5) **Answer** as many questions as possible for a given passage, guess on the rest (after eliminating obviously incorrect answers), and then move to the next passage (in your priority order).
- 6) With 5 minutes left on the test, go to each unanswered question and guess, using any eliminated answers to your advantage.
- 7) **Don't get "stuck"** spending minutes on tough questions that you never complete.
